RE: H.2986 An Act authorizing a local affordable housing surcharge

Dear Chairman Hinds, Chairman Cusack, and Esteemed Members of the Committee,

I write to you today to advocate for H.2986, an Act authorizing a local affordable housing surcharge. This is a piece of critical legislation that will allow cities and towns to impose a local affordable housing surcharge on specific real property.

Adopting strategies through policy guidance to expand and promote affordable housing is vital to creating and sustaining equitable, thriving constituencies. One such affordable housing strategy, which this legislation provides a framework for, is using an accessible housing surcharge, where profits would proceed to an affordable housing trust.

As this bill specifies, the surcharge would be no more than 2% of the real estate tax levy against real property. Yet, the modest surcharge demonstrates the considerable potential to increase and effectively finance affordable housing if implemented. Following the bill's guidance, tax collectors would collect the surcharge amount according to the warrant-specified computation and direct the funds quarterly or semi-annually to the affordable housing trust.

Implementing this model to support affordable housing with an accessible surcharge serves as a cost-effective investment in Massachusetts affordable housing solutions, an investment that will benefit all of us.

I respectfully request that the committee advance H.2986 with a favorable report. This legislation and the surcharge model it authorizes would create a strategic process to broaden affordable housing and safeguard the well-being of the Commonwealth.
